Commander's Report Cdr. Roger Simmons, SN

Greetings: I hope this report finds all of you recovering from the holiday season and anxiously anticipating the arrival of our new year. Our Squadron will be having a new year's celebration of sorts on 21 January. The event is our 60th Annual Change of Watch Ceremony to be held at Porters Neck Country Club. As most of you know, this is an occasion whereby the Officers and Executive Committee members for the current year are retired and the new slate of elected officers are installed to serve for the upcoming year. This will be an evening of entertainment with lots of awards and presentations and even a bit of humor. So, please mark your calendar and join us for a night of fun-filled activities as we "ring in" the new slate of officers and "ring out" the old.

Our Squadron year is winding down, and this will be my last *Foghorn* report to you as Commander. As I reflect back over our activities for the year, I feel compelled to comment on a few of our accomplishments. For those of you that attended our Change of Watch Ceremony last year, you may recall a few challenges I threw out to some of our members. One such challenge was to Lt Ken Newland, JN, our Membership Chairman, to bring in 20 new members this year and a personal challenge to install at least one new member at each of our Squadron membership meetings. I am pleased to report that as of the date of the writing of this report, 38 new members have been added to our roster, and thus far new members have been installed at each of our membership meetings. As part of the new member orientation process, 21 attended one of the two new member receptions held this year and 27 members attending received credit for completion of operations training. You have heard me say on numerous occasions that the two most fulfilling things a Squadron Commander can do is install new members and recognize existing members for their contributions to our Squadron. This year, approximately 80 merit marks (40% of our membership) were issued to members, recognizing them for their efforts and contributions to Cape Fear Sail & Power Squadron.

Our meetings were often informative, but always entertaining and well attended thanks to the efforts of 1/Lt Jonnie' Chardonn, P and her committee members. Several of our functions were attended by 80-90 members and guests. Our boating activities were well planned and included cruises and on-the-water events for all long-distance cruises (Myrtle Beach and Oriental), area cruises (South Harbor Village, Southport and Downtown Wilmington), and a varied assortment of day cruises and raft-ups. Many of our members participated in these activities and all seemed to have lots of fun. Lt Mark Stacy, AP* certainly deserves an "atta boy" in his role as chairman of our boating activities.

On the community activities front, we were very active. Under the leadership of Lt William Miller, S, we performed 279 vessel inspections to boaters in the area. Our cooperative charting program was reinvigorated late this year because of the efforts of Lt/C Ron Tilmon, JN. We received national recognition for our efforts and activities in promoting "National Safe Boating Week." We initiated a relationship with the USCG with many of their personnel and officers attending several of our Squadron functions.

Such an exam signifies that your boat has been examined and has all required safety equipment on board, as well as insuring everything is in operational order. We can always use more of our members to become VSE's to further assist us in our efforts. If you are interested in becoming a Vessel Safety Examiner, please contact Lt Bill Miller to let him know.

We also had a very favorable year with our Cooperative Charting (Co-Op) Program with the National



Boat Operator Certification Program (BOC) Lt/C Ron Tilmon, JN

In response to actions underway in the United Nations to promote safer boating, the U.S. Power Squadrons in conjunction with the U.S. Coast Guard are developing a new program to "certify" boaters and their demonstrated capabilities.

There are four certified levels being developed. Each one of these levels requires completion of certain educational courses/seminars and an observed on-the-water demonstration of the boater's boat-handling skills.

Four levels are being developed: Inland Navigator (IN), Coastal Navigator (CN), Advanced Coastal Navigator (ACN), and Offshore Navigator (ON). Each level requires more advanced education and boat handling demonstrations. At the current time, only the IN and CN levels are available with the rest to follow ASAP.

There are also endorsements available: They are "CAN" for Canadian regulations, "EURO" for European regulations, "IW" for Inland Waterways (specifically dealing with locks, dams, and other inland issues relating to currents, rapids, etc.), "MEX" for Mexican regulations, "PAD" for paddle boats, and "SA" for sailboats.

To date, P/C Harold Beatty and myself have been certified as IN's. I have been certified as an Advanced Certifier who can certify on-the-water skills.

The course material for each level costs \$30 plus shipping/handling and sales tax. Material can be ordered through the Squadron Education Department (Lt/C Peter Dahl, JN).

If you are interested in pursuing one of these levels, please contact Lt/C Peter Dahl, JN to order your material. It includes a "passport" to be utilized to document your education and boat handling skills, and each must be signed off by an approved BOC certifier.

In addition to attending our classes which will save you money on your boat insurance, being certified at the various levels of the Boating Operations Certification Program also provides substantial additional discounts.

For the coming year, P/C Harold Beatty, AP has graciously agreed to spearhead our BOC program efforts for the coming year. I urge all members who are interested in enhancing their boating education and on-the-water skills to contact Harold with any questions they may have. #
